The Co-production Board meets quarterly and is chaired by **Chris Badger**, Director of Adult Care Services and **Tinu Adewoye**, an unpaid family carer. Members include carers and officers from social care, health, and the voluntary sector.

The Board receives reports about the delivery of the **Carers Strategy** and service developments of interest to carers. It is also somewhere we can take issues – particularly when they have been raised by a number of carers and represent a wide experience.

Social Care Costs - Charging for Social Care and Support and Financial Assessments

Hertfordshire County Council Adult Care Services wish to provide carers with financial information and guidance relating to paying for care and support (social care costs) to carers of adults who have a learning disability, and/or autism, and/or physical disability and to carers of older people who are using community or residential services. This would include people who are in supported living accommodation, their own family homes, extra care or sheltered housing but not residential or nursing home care.

Joe Wanyoni Head of Service, Care Reform, Finance, Income and Charging will be presenting two session the following sessions:

Session 1: Demystifying Charging for Social care and Financial Assessments

- What can be included as a Disability Related Expense?
- Who can families discuss this with?
- What can families do if they don't agree with the decision about how much someone is required to contribute towards the cost of their services?

Neurodiversity and Employment Talk

Are you supporting a young Autistic person or someone with ADHD? Are you wondering how entering the working environment might be for them? Would you like to hear what it was like directly from someone with neurodiversity? Louis Sanford shares his experience of the world of work as a Neurodiverse individual. Louis is currently a programme manager working across the NHS, Social Care, and voluntary sector improving services for people with Severe Mental Illness, Learning Disabilities and Autism; and provides insightful reflections and relatable anecdotes for some of the 31 jobs he has had up to the age of 25, what it means to himself accepting his own Neurodiversity today, and what it means for him as a parent of two neurodiverse children.

Direct Payment Talk

Direct Payments are an alternative way to organise and receive care – rather than the local authority providing care, a person (or someone acting on their behalf) can be paid directly to self-direct their own care. This gives greater choice and flexibility. Carers in Hertfordshire have asked Hazel Yabsley (Team Manager) and Andy Lawrence (Head of Service 0-25 Together Team) to come along and give an online

Direct Payments Talk

Have you ever wondered if there was a different way to receive support and services from Hertfordshire County Council? Have you heard of Direct Payments? Carers in Hertfordshire are organising two talks (one in person and one evening zoom event) introducing carers to the Direct Payment scheme.

Direct Payments – what are they?

Direct Payments are an alternative way to organise and receive care – rather than the local authority providing care, a person (or someone acting on their behalf) can be paid directly to self-direct their own care. This gives greater choice and flexibility. Carers in Hertfordshire have asked Sam Wood-Ede (Direct Payments Manager, and advocate of direct payments from personal experience) to come along and give an interactive talk to carers. Sam will be able to guide you through the step-by-step process, with examples of when direct payments work well and the challenges they might bring up, as well as answer any questions you may have such as:

What are direct payments, and who is eligible?



- How do they work?
- What are their main benefits and drawbacks
