We're looking for some volunteer Wardens to help us look after the three Destination Plus Circular Routes. These routes are in Leighton Buzzard, in Ampthill and between Biggleswade, Sutton and Potton.

These Routes help people get outdoors so that they can come to appreciate the distinctive and loved Greensand Country. We're looking for keen walkers, but you don't need any previous experience of being a Volunteer Warden. You just need enthusiasm and passion and a love of the Greensand Country landscape.

Take a walk around one of the 3 routes in the Greensand Country area and report back on the condition of the surface, signage, vegetation clearance

Where is the Greensand Country?










Greensand Country is an island of distinctive, beautiful and loved countryside in the heart of Bedfordshire.

It is a landscape rich in wildlife and cultural heritage, with its own special qualities and sense of place.

An oasis of relative peace, quiet, solitude and well-being, it is a place where people feel able to slow down, unwind and connect with nature. It is somewhere to escape city life, breathe easy and feel uplifted.



Why this role is important to us:

The Greensand Country is the wooded sandstone ridge with its associated river valleys to the south of Bedford. It is surrounded by clay vales.

The Greensand Country was considered for centuries as 'marginal land' because of the lightness and acidity of the sandy soils. The area was used by major landowners for hunting, recreation, forestry, heathland and livestock grazing. The aristocracy built manor houses for themselves and estate villages for their workers. The natural habitats of this Greensand landscape are heather heathland, acidic grassland and woodland.







Today this heritage is disappearing, due to changing land use and modern built development. In the 'Greensand Country' Landscape Partnership programme, we are bringing the key partners in the landscape together to reverse some of this decline. It will raise awareness amongst local people and visitors about the Greensand Country's unique heritage, and involve them in creating a sustainable future.

These three promoted routes have been selected in areas with new developments. They are to encourage the new people moving into the Greensand Country to appreciate their new environment.


We will pay reasonable expenses.
