

For the attention of all users of Parker Velcon threaded-base coalescer elements

Background

JIG received the attached announcement, that was disseminated by Parker Velcon through their network of distributors.

As noted in the attached Parker Velcon announcement, instances have been reported of threaded base end caps separating from filter coalescer elements manufactured in the period October to November 2017.

As noted by Parker Velcon, elements manufactured over this period used threaded base end caps from an alternative supplier, however Parker Velcon do not have definitive evidence of the root cause and are still working to understand it conclusively.

Case for action

Users of Parker Velcon threaded-base coalescer elements shall follow all required actions specified in the attached announcement by Parker Velcon.

If JIG receives additional information, either directly from end users or from the filter manufacturer following the conclusion of the investigation, that warrants a different set of actions than what is specified in the attached announcement, JIG will provide additional guidance through a new JIG Bulletin.
