

What makes potential liabilities unclear?

Sharing of services and commingling of products make liability difficult to assess in the event of an incident.

Centralised airport infrastructure not owned by the operator adds further complexity.

However:

Santa Barbara Oil Spill 1969

SANTA BARBARA OIL SPILL

- Revealed over-exposure to JV Operations.
- Insurance policy conditions were changed.
- The "Joint Venture Endorsement Clause" limited a JV-owner's coverage to its percentage shareholding.







Impact on the aviation fuel-handling community



First flight B-747, Feb 1969

AVIATION FUEL HANDLING BUSINESS

- Growth is managed by forming joint ventures to manage operations.
- But Fuel Suppliers remained 100% responsible for any claims from customers.
- Current insurance coverage was not adequate.







Aircraft Refuelling Endorsement (1971)



Risk Allocation within Joint Ventures

AIRCRAFT REFUELLING LIABILITY INSURANCE

- A joint industry/insurance working group found a solution to restore full insurance coverage, under certain conditions.
- This is formalised in the "Aircraft Refuelling Endorsement 1971".
- It is still present today in most insurance policy documents.
- Tarbox Agreements are Industry Good Practice tools to comply with the insurance requirement.







What are Tarbox Agreements?

- Formal Agreements between fuel suppliers⁽¹⁾
 using the same shared facility.
- Each supplier:
 - Accepts sole liability for incidents involving its customers.
 - Indemnifies and holds harmless all other suppliers using the same joint facilities.
- Thereby complying with the requirements of the Aircraft Refuelling Endorsement 1971.
- (1) Some legal structures also require the facility operator to be a signatory.









Are Tarbox Agreements still relevant today?

- ✓ Potential liabilities arising from aircraft refuelling activities have not changed.
- ✓ Operations through joint facilities are increasing.
- ✓ It is common practice for aviation fuel suppliers to use insurance policies to cover all or part of their potential contractual liabilities.
- ✓ Most insurance policies still contain the conditions defined in the Joint Venture Endorsement Clause and Aircraft Refuelling Endorsement 1971.





If Tarbox Agreements are not signed by all suppliers using a joint facility, there is a risk of insurance policies being invalid.

Tarbox Agreements in detail









A "Tarbox" event needs....



- A target aircraft
- An aircraft refuelling operation
- From a supplier named in advance
- Using facilities shared or used by more than one supplier







Tarbox: Gross Negligence & Wilful Misconduct



Why are GN/WM excluded from the Tarbox Indemnities?

- 1. The 2013 review considered it unreasonable to indemnify a 3rd party for their GN/WM.
- 2. Since that time, many jurisdictions (>30) have made it unlawful or against public policy to indemnify 3rd parties against GN/WM.
- 3. This means that even in countries where the law does not prohibit the indemnity, the courts are likely not to support it if there is a claim.

Impact:

- A. Some locations that have not adopted post-2015 agreements may need to re-consider.
- B. The GN/WM carve-out is one of the reasons why it is good practice, for example, to have an agreement at ADH and IP level.

Tarbox: Why English Law?



Why is English Law used in Tarbox Agreements?

- 1. Its established role in the Aviation and Insurance sectors.
- 2. English law does not have statutory definitions of gross negligence or wilful misconduct, and therefore interprets them according to contract.
- 3. Therefore increases the enforceability of contractual indemnities

Impact:

- A. Companies advised to take legal advice if adapting a local agreement to local laws.
- B. Local laws increase the likelihood of the contract not being interpreted as intended in the event of a dispute.







What types of facility / operations can be covered?

Exhibits 1A and 1B

Supports one supplier accepting another's credit card/carnet or marketing agreement with being physically active at location.




Exhibits 2A and 2B

Supports Throughput Agreements when the Operators is a fuel supplier or independent Service Provider.

Exhibit 5

Reciprocal Agreement for two fuel-handling companies to provide operational support to each other at the same location.



Exhibits 3A and 3B

Limited Company JVs (Inc JV), selfoperated or by Service Provider.

Exhibits 4A and 4B

Less formal JV arrangements (Non-Inc JV), operated by one of the Partners, or a Service Provider.








Coordination of Tarbox compliance at Airports



What could happen if Tarbox is not signed?



POSSIBLE OUTCOMES:

- 1. Neither Supplier is insured because they are not in compliance with their policy conditions.
- 2. Litigation between both suppliers to discover which is responsible.
- 3. Litigation with operating company to try to prove negligence or GN/WM.
- 4. Litigation with other suppliers if a batch of fuel is found to be off-specification.
- 5. Litigation with Facilities owner if facilities found to be inadequate.
